#### **Course Maintenance:**

#### RAKING BUNKERS AND FIXING DIVOTS

To help preserve course conditions and ensure an enjoyable experience for all golfers, please follow these important maintenance guidelines:

- Rake bunkers properly: After use, place the rake inside the bunker with the handle resting on the lip and the tines down in the sand. Watch a short video on proper bunker raking technique here.
- Repair all ball marks: Always fix your ball mark (and others' marks) on the green to keep putting surfaces smooth and playable.
- Fill fairway divots: Use the fairway sand provided on rental carts. If you're using a personal cart, sand is available at the golf shop. Learn the correct way to repair divots here.

Standing water is considered an Abnormal Course Condition (Rule 16.1c)—so you're entitled to relief:

- **Free relief:** Drop the ball within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief inside the bunker, no closer to the hole.
- **Penalty relief:** Prefer to drop outside the bunker? You may do so by keeping the original spot between the hole and where you drop—two-stroke penalty applies.

All practice balls must be purchased at the range shack before using a mat. Here's how:

- 1. Show your resident ID to the attendant.
- Choose a bucket size—charges go to your golf account.
- **3.** Head to an open stall and place balls in the tray.
- **4.** Hit only at the range—do not remove balls. Only range balls allowed; no outside balls permitted.

## Golf Cart Guidelines: Play Smart, Stay Safe

Help keep the course in top shape and the game enjoyable by following these quick cart tips:

- 90-degree rule: Stay on the path until you're level with your ball—then turn at a right angle to minimize turf damage.
- **Drive safely:** Carts aren't cars—avoid wet areas, bunker edges, mounds, tee boxes and greens. Stay alert to golfers around you.
- **Keep pace:** On cart-path-only days, bring multiple clubs to your ball. Drop off your partner, then head to your shot—no unnecessary delays.
- Clean up: At the end of your round, check for head covers, rangefinders, speakers and other gear—don't leave anything behind.
