

### **DON'T IGNORE THE SIGNS!**

There are many important signs posted throughout our golf course that require everyone's attention. Here's what a few of them mean:

- Cart sign with an arrow Follow the arrow to return to the cart path.
- Stop sign Just like on the road, means stop! These appear at blind spots or busy crossings. Always come to a full stop, look both ways and proceed with caution.

These signs help keep everyone safe. Thanks for doing your part and staying alert!

# Follow the 90-degree rule

To protect our fairways, please drive along the cart path or rough as far as possible, then make a



90-degree turn to your ball. This simple rule helps prevent damage from carts.

Remember: the fairway is not a freeway! Thanks for helping us keep the course in top shape.



# **GOLF ETIQUETTE**

When someone is in your line of sight

It's perfectly okay to speak up if someone is distracting you during your shot—just keep it courteous. Here are a few polite ways to ask them to move:

- "Would you mind stepping aside? You're in my line of sight, and it's a little distracting."
- "Could you move just a bit? I need a clear view for this shot."
- "Quick heads-up—standing in a golfer's line of sight can be distracting. Mind sliding over a little?"

A kind reminder goes a long way to keeping play respectful and enjoyable for everyone.

# **Important Notice:**

Golf Course Tee Time Reservations

To ensure fair access and avoid lost revenue for the community, we kindly ask all players to **either show up for their reserved tee times or cancel in advance**. Unused and uncanceled reservations prevent others from playing and impact course operations.

#### Please take note of the following policy:

 No-show fee: If a reservation is not canceled, the player will be charged a no-show fee equal to an 18-hole green fee and marked as a noshow in their profile. After four no-shows, online booking privileges will be suspended.

#### **How to Cancel a Reservation**

- Online:
- Log in to ForeUp, locate your tee time, and click

  Cancel
- **Each player** must cancel individually—canceling your own reservation does not cancel the entire group.
- By phone (for group cancellations):
- Call the Pro Shop at **949-597-4336**, and staff will remove all players.

Loose impediments are natural objects not fixed or growing—think stones, leaves, twigs or small branches. You may remove them without penalty, even in bunkers and penalty areas, as long as your ball doesn't move. A few specifics to keep in mind:

- Mulch around the course is a loose impediment and may be moved to play your shot.
- **Sand** is only considered a loose impediment on the putting green. It cannot be cleared elsewhere.

**Important:** If your ball moves while removing a loose impediment, it must be replaced and you'll incur a one-stroke penalty.
