## FOREUP TEE TIME BOOKING JUST GOT AN UPGRADE

We've made some changes to the ForeUP online booking portal, and we want to make sure you're in the know.

Whether you're a tech pro or just getting comfortable with online reservations, these updates are designed to make booking your next round easier than ever.

### Booking Tips and Reminders

- If you book a tee time and leave three player spots blank (e.g., for guests), and then cancel your own reservation, the entire tee time will be cancelled.
- To avoid this, we recommend entering names for all players. If you need to cancel the entire tee time after adding names, please call the golf shop directly at **949-597-4336** to cancel all players associated with that reservation.

### Google Chrome Is the Browser for the Job

ForeUP works best with Google Chrome, which is available on all types of devices. Other browsers, like Safari, only work on Apple devices and may not provide the best user experience.



### How to set Google Chrome Default Browser

### A Note From Tom McCray

I hope you're enjoying the start of the summer season. As a friendly reminder, please make sure that all players bring their IDs and check in at the window before heading out to play.

We've recently had a few situations where a resident has checked in for a spouse or friend, only for a non-resident guest to take that spot. This is considered an attempt to receive resident rates for someone who isn't eligible, and it may lead to a call from Community Compliance and possible suspension of amenity use.

Residents are always welcome to bring guests (one before 10 a.m., and up to three after 10 a.m.) but guests must check in and pay the guest rate. Our staff is here to protect fair use of the courses and ensure all residents enjoy the amenities they pay for.

Thank you for helping us keep things running smoothly.

## RULES CORNER



We've received questions about areas on the course marked with red lines or stakes. These markings may now include parts of what were previously considered out-of-bounds areas.

Once an area is marked as a penalty area, it should be treated as such, even if the ball crosses what used to be an out-of-bounds line. This change is intended to improve pace of play and give golfers another option if a ball is lost or goes out in these zones.

If your ball crosses into one of these marked areas, you'll need to determine the point where it last crossed the margin. You can then take relief by dropping within two club lengths of that spot, no closer to the hole, with a one-stroke penalty.

If you find your ball and it's playable, you're welcome to play it as it lies with no penalty.
